A leading Bay Area guitarist, Mark Simons has performed at Herbst Theater and the Palace of the Legion of Honor. A member of the groundbreaking San Francisco Guitar Quartet, he also frequently performs as a soloist and in duet with flutist Catherine Payne of the San Francisco Symphony and with Grammy winning guitarist, Scott Tennant. A Fulbright Scholar, Mark is an Honors Graduate of the New England Conservatory, Peabody Conservatory and University of Southern California. He currently teaches privately, in San Francisco (North Beach), at the City College of San Francisco and Diablo Valley College.



David Dueñas

David Dueñas, a versatile performer and teacher, began playing the guitar at age 12 at the Guam Academy of Music and Arts, under the virtuoso flamenco guitarist, Adelo Alcaraz. Mr. Dueñas received a Bachelors Degree in Music from the California State University in Hayward, and a Masters in Music from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. He is a founding member of the San Francisco Guitar Quartet and is sought after as a classical guitar soloist and jazz guitarist. He has performed with the Orchestra de Lyon, France, San Jose Jazz Festival, Omni Performances, San Francisco Classical Guitar Society, and Centro Universitario Marianum, Rome, Italy. In addition to his faculty position at Santa Clara University, Mr. Dueñas teaches at Civic Arts Education in Walnut Creek.

Patrick Francis is an active performer, composer, and arranger. He has created numerous scores and arrangements for the SFGQ, as well as feature film, video, choreography, and theater. His original chamber music (www.Azulao.com) was featured on National Public Radio's "All Songs Considered" website. Patrick holds a Doctor of Musical Arts degree, has taught for over two decades, and his instructional articles on guitar technique have been featured in Acoustic Guitar Magazine.

Shortly after Patrick O'Connell began playing the guitar, he was performing around the country in master classes held by such artists as Christopher Parkening, Manuel Barrueco, Antigoni Goni, Scott Tennant, Aniello Desiderio, and Tilman Hoppstock. He received his Bachelors degree in guitar performance from the Peabody Conservatory of Music under the tutelage of Manuel Barrueco and Ray Chester, in 2003. Patrick was awarded the extraordinary opportunity of giving his Carnegie Hall debut in 2005. In 2006, Patrick received his Masters degree from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music where he studied with David Tanenbaum, Dusan Bogdanovic, and Mark Teicholz.
